

# PASSENGER SAFETY

We are pleased to have you join us on our special rail venture. Please familiarize yourself with the following safety guidelines, and follow these instructions. Our service attendants will be pleased to explain any questions you have.

1. Board and detrain only at attended vestibule doors, observation deck or platform side gates. Vestibule doors, observation deck and platform side gates must remain closed while the train is moving. Only authorized personnel may open these after a full stop.
  2. NEVER attempt to board or detrain a moving train.
  3. When moving about the car, walk, do not run.
  4. Be alert for sudden starts or stops. Keep your hands out of your pockets and assume a wider than normal stance with knees bent to avoid losing balance.
  5. Shoes suitable for secure footing should be worn inside and outside the car. No bare feet are allowed.
  6. Small children must be accompanied by an adult.
  7. Hold handrails when ascending and descending stairs.
  8. Dome areas shall be vacated when traveling under catenary Wires.
  9. Do not tamper with any interior or exterior car safety apparatus.
  10. Horseplay will not be tolerated. We reserve the right to remove any passenger from the train whose behavior becomes objectionable to his fellow passengers or threatens the safety and security of the railcar.
  11. Amtrak, Via, and many railroads have banned or restrained platform riding throughout their systems. Breaching this safety code could result in your removal from this rail car.
- Special trains and excursion trips may allow open platform or vestibule riding. Check with your train master.

The conductor, road foreman or train master has absolute authority over this or any other problems, and has the final word.

12. Please familiarize yourself with the location of exit doors, emergency windows and fire extinguishers.
13. No smoking in bed. No throwing of any refuse from the train. Lighted cigarettes may cause track fires.
14. Use caution when showering. The car motion could cause you to slip and fall.
16. No beverages are permitted on the vestibule or outside when the car is standing on railroad property.
17. Let your car attendant know before you get off at an intermediate stop. Otherwise, you may be left behind.
18. When you get off a standing train, look up, down and around for any holes, slippery spots or obstructions. Watch the gap between railcar and flooring at stations with high level platforms. Maintain your handholds until your foot is firmly placed on the platform or elsewhere.
19. Stand clear of and do not lean against a standing train. Expect the car to move at any time on any track in either direction.
